
Hung on entrance door to voting enclosure and on BOE photo ID H-frame sign by sidewalk.

Used to direct voters to the appropriate Registration Table "Wait Here" line.





If you must wait, please stand behind the *blue line*

Placed beside the Ballot Table Waiting Area.




Sign on a file jacket for placement over the top of a standard BOE sign stand. A duplicate of the sign is on the other side of the jacket. The red arrow points to the red painters tape arrows along the floor path. The stand is placed at the start of the path from the voting booths to the Tabulator.





Placed on the Tabulator tray to cover a small slot, which is used only for narrow ExpressVote ballots. The arrow points to the larger slot, used for the wider, regular ballots.




Large, three-panel, very visible sign hung on a chair at the turn in the path from the voting booths area to the Tabulator.



Metal (24" x 24") "No Left Turn" (NLT) sign, used to tell drivers not to try to make a 180-degree turn into the curbside parking area entrance.

This sign is hung on an A-frame near the entrance to the curbside parking area. Also hung on this frame is a standard BOE "Curbside Voting" sign, facing in the opposite direction; I added a red arrow below it. See the picture at the right.

The A-frame is perpendicular to the traffic lanes beside the curbside parking area to make the NLT show what turn is not allowed.



Laminated arrow on back of my "No Left Turn" metal sign, visible below the BOE "Curbside Voting" sign hung on the same A-frame. The arrow points to the entrance to the curbside voting area.



Hung on the curbside stand, below the doorbell button. Now put in a Ziploc bag.



Sign is hung on an A-frame and placed near the "No Left Turn" A-frame. This Aframe is oriented parallel to the traffic lanes beside the curbside parking area to make the sign easy to read from a car. This is a corrugated plastic sign and was supplied by the BOE.



Laminated arrow on back of BOE "Go <u>AROUND</u> the LOOP" A-frame sign. The arrow points to the curbside stand.

These two laminated signs are hung (stacked as shown) on some otherwise unused Aframe. The stand is placed on or near the sidewalk across from the doorbell stand. The arrows point to the curbside stand.



Sign and rod hung on the school's carpool traffic cones, as shown in the picture below.



Laminated sign placed on the back of the Chief Judge's car to indicate it is parked legally at the end of the curbside area.

Space Is Used for Curbside Voting Exit

Placed on an A-frame to keep people from parking in a place for which we have no cones. The sign is laminated.




Hung on the entrance door to the voting enclosure at 7:30 P.M. The sign is laminated.






Used white vinyl tape to make arrowheads bigger on these BOE H-frame signs.

Used blue vinyl tape to underline "NOT" on a large BOE H-frame sign. Placed at two "gotcha" entrances along Granite Falls Blvd.





Some Other Items



Pocket folders used to distribute items to various areas during Monday Setup.



Binders (notebooks) used for BOE documents and for my material.

File jackets for placement over the top of Registration Table sign stands. A sheet of paper is taped to each file jacket and letters are written on the paper.
